Nurture, Aspire, Believe, Achieve

AIM

The aim of this funding is to improve the Physical Education (PE) and Sports programmes offered by primary schools, and is provided jointly by various governmental departments, including Education, Health and Culture, and Media and Sport. Although the funding will be allocated to primary school head teachers, it will be 'ring fenced' – this means that it can only be spent specifically on PE and sport in schools. Purpose of funding Schools must spend the additional funding on improving their provision of PE and sport, though how they do this remains their decision.

This is how Brierley Primary School plans to use the funding in 2019-20:

- Employ a specialist Teacher of Physical Education to deliver PE across the school and to deliver the extra-curricular programme at lunchtimes and after-school.
- Paying for specialist qualified sports coaches to provide before and after school clubs to develop skills in specific sports, as well as providing additional spaces for children to participate at these clubs.
- Increasing pupil participation in inter and intra school sports competitions through running events during PE lessons, at lunchtimes and after-school, helping to maintain our Sainsbury's School Games Mark Gold Award.
- Implementing new and innovative ways of engaging all pupils in regular physical activity in line with the Chief Medical Officer guidelines.
- Purchasing quality resources to support the delivery of school sports clubs and PE lessons which will also mean that we can run 'active' clubs for whole families in all weather conditions
- Supporting and engaging the least active children through offering a wide range of clubs, attending Games for All festivals and offering priority places to these pupils.
- Paying for professional development opportunities for teachers in PE and sport.
- Hiring specialist qualified Gymnastics coaches to work with Y6 pupils in curriculum and with the staff for CPD.

For the academic year 2019-20, Brierley Primary School will be allocated **£17,790** of sports funding and this is topped up by funds allocated to PE and school sport from within the school budget. Below you will find a full breakdown of how the sports funding will be allocated and the potential impact of this.

PROVISION

- PE is taught by a specialist full-time Teacher of Physical Education and class teachers. Class teachers who do teach PE lessons will work with the PE Instructor to plan and assess lessons to ensure consistency in approach.
- The school will offer a variety of sports clubs before, during and after school. The specialist PE teacher will offer 4-5 clubs per week, with other members of staff offering additional sports clubs or providing assistance to allow more pupils to participate. In addition to this, we will have various external coaches to offer clubs in a wide range of specialist areas.

- The school maximises our outdoor space by hiring the Cumberland Area for PE sessions during the Summer Term, for home football fixtures and for forest school / OAA sessions.
- The school provides a competition t-shirt to ensure that children look smart at competitive events taking place at external venues. The school has a separate football kit for both the Y3/4 and Y5/6 Football teams to wear when representing the school.
- Quality resources are continually replaced to ensure the children have access to equipment that is appropriate for competing in level 2 and 3 competitions.
- The school provide funding for transport to and from level 2 and 3 competitions throughout the year.
- The school celebrates achievements across the school year with an annual Sports Awards Evening in July. This rewards both team and individual successes in a range of sports, PE lessons, extra-curricular activities and sports leadership.

REPORTING

The school reports the use of funding on the school website and shall continue to inform parents of PE provision in regular updates in the school newsletter which is emailed to parents and also through social media (PE Twitter feed and school Facebook page). There is also a sporting achievements board near the school hall which details competition results and shows team photographs.

EVIDENCE OF IMPACT

1.The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – kick-starting healthy active lifestyles	All KS1 and KS2 children receive at least 2 hours PE a week. A variety of engaging physical activities are promoted to ensure playtimes and lunch times are active. Pupils in KS2 also take part in regular House Competitions at lunchtimes. All KS1 and KS2 children have access variety of resources and activities at break and lunchtimes. A wide variety of clubs are on offer every night after school. All clubs (whether led by PE specialist, teachers or external coaches) are free of charge to parents in order to try to encourage active lifestyles. Pupils have activity breaks on non-PE days to meet the 30 minutes per day. These breaks take the form of active playtimes, Just Dance and Supermovers. The school will be setting up a 'Daily Mile' for all year groups to ensure each child is active every day and to set	The children have access to outstanding teaching in PE. Progress in lessons is excellent as the lessons are taught by a highly-qualified specialist teacher. Participation in after school clubs is high. Children have the opportunity to be physically active every day (exceeding the 30 minutes minimum guidance encouraged by the government).

2. The profile of PE and sport being raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement	The profile of PE at Brierley Primary School is already extremely high. The PE subject leader has the full backing of the senior leadership team, so can ensure that PE is a development priority across the school. Regular PE updates are uploaded to social media platforms and match reports feature in the newsletters to parents. The school has house captains and playground leader groups who promote physical activity. They organise lunchtime activities and are responsible for setting up equipment. Achievements in school sport and outside activities are celebrated regularly in our achievement assemblies and on the sports noticeboard.	The school was awarded the Sainsbury's School Games Gold award for 2018/19 which has now been held for 3 years. We will be striving to achieve Platinum in the near future.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport	PE lessons are taught by our specialist PE teacher, specialist coaches and the class teachers who are supported in their planning and delivery. Teachers often support the PE specialist in delivering after-school sports clubs in order to increase participation and to increase their own confidence and knowledge of different sports.	The delivery of PE across the school continues to be of a high standard.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils	The PE curriculum is written to ensure that children have access to developing a wide range of sports with an opportunity to develop this further. All pupils have the opportunity to sign up for specialist extra-curricular sports clubs that feature sports not currently on our PE curriculum (e.g. boxing, martial arts, cheerleading).	Across the school, all children have the opportunity to learn a wide variety of sports.
5. Increased participation in competitive sport	All children take part in a House competition at the end of each PE unit. House Cup competitions run at lunchtimes, offering a huge variety of different sports and activities. We enter level 2 competitions in at least 10 different sports each year with further opportunity to then proceed to level 3. We have entered B and C teams into sports competitions	We have regularly attended level 2 competitions and as a result of our success we have been able to represent the district in the Cheshire & Warrington School Games (Level 3 competition).

SPENDING

- Brierley Primary School received **£17,790** in Sports Premium and there was **£6,557** of additional money from the school budget allocated to the provision of PE and Sport, taking the total spend to **£24,347**.
- Funds allocated to employing a full time PE specialist to teach PE across all year groups, deliver Forest Schools / OAA, organise teams / attend school games competitions and be responsible for the extra-curricular sports provision: **£17,790**
- Hiring of external coaches to enhance the school's extra-curricular sports club offering and to try to maximise participation. Coaches were used to deliver Boxing, Martial Arts, Cricket, Street Dance and Cheerleading. Total spend: **£1,139**
- Hire of the Cumberland Arena during the Summer Term to enable pupils to use the Astroturf and Athletics track for the delivery of Cricket, Rounders, Athletics and Ultimate Frisbee. Hire also includes Y6 sports afternoon at Crewe Lifestyle Centre and Astroturf hire for home football fixtures. Total spend: **£598**
- Annual payment to the Crewe & Nantwich School Sports Partnership to allow entry into Level 2 (and opportunity for Level 3) School Games Competitions and to get access to partnership support: **£600**
- Annual payment to Crewe & Nantwich Junior Football Association to allow entry into the different football competitions held in the local area: **£40**
- Renewal of existing sports equipment (such as Netball posts and footballs) as well as investment in Forest School area at the Cumberland Arena to improve OAA provision/ opportunities. New equipment purchased to enable increased participation / high quality teaching in Cricket (wickets, bats, tennis balls), Rugby (balls), Dodgeball (balls), Gymnastics (large gym mats) and Forest School (fire pit, gloves, firesteels, gazebo, clay, cooking equipment). Total spend: **£2075**
- Annual Brierley Sports Awards Evening to celebrate and recognise both team and individual sporting achievements over the school year. Trophies, refreshments and room decorations: **£275**
- Transporting pupils to sporting events and to Year 6 OAA residential: **£830**
- School contribution to reduce price of Year 6 OAA residential to Colomendy, North Wales. This is made in order to try to make the trip accessible to more families, thus allowing more pupils to gain incredible life experiences: **£1000**
